Part II Information Sheets for the Questionnaires

Information Sheet 1 Birth Defects and Familial Diseases

Birth Defects and Birth Anomalies

Any condition that was present at birth, although may not have been noticed until later, where a part of the body was incompletely or not properly formed, or was unusual compared with most people including:

- Hare lip (cleft lip)
- Hole in the roof of the mouth (cleft palate)
- Heart murmurs and heart defects (e.g. hole in the heart/problems with the valves in the heart)
- Spina bifida
- Anencephaly (small or no brain)
- Other problems with the brain
- Unusual shaped head (e.g. high forehead, very broad head, parts of skull stand out),
- Large and/or grooved tongue
- Problems with eyes (e.g. no iris or part of iris missing)
- Unusual ears (e.g. low set, creases in ear lobes)
- Unusual features on the chest (e.g. more than 2 nipples, funnel chest)
- Stomach wall not closed properly (hernia of umbilicus, omphalocele)
- One or more parts of the body bigger on one side than the other (arms, legs, face)
- Extra fingers or toes
- Webbed fingers or toes
- Anything else unusual about arms, legs, hands and feet
- Organs of the body not formed properly or unusual shape/size or missing (e.g. diaphragmatic hernia, oesophagus atresia, particularly large kidneys, liver, spleen etc, single kidney, horseshoe kidney, cystic organs)
- Undescended testicles
- Unusual coloured patches on the skin or other birthmarks including large moles

Tumors, Cancers, Cysts, Leukaemia.

- Cancers or carcinomas of particular parts of the body such as lung, bowel (colon or rectum), breast, prostate, bladder, cervix, womb, ovary, pancreas, stomach, kidney
- Cancers of bone, cartilage, muscle, fat, fibrous tissue (sarcoma)
- Hodgkin's disease
- Lymphoma
- Leukaemia, other sorts of cancer affecting the blood system
- Brain cancer or brain tumors
- Other tumors or cysts, any other growths (please say which parts of the body were affected); these include fibromas, lipomas, bony lumps, ovarian or breast cysts.

Diseases and other conditions that can be inherited.

These diseases and conditions are uncommon. The medical names are listed below. You will probably only know about these conditions if a doctor has diagnosed one or more in members of your family.

- Li-Fraumeni Syndrome
- Naevoid basal cell carcinoma syndrome (Gorlin Syndrome)
